



It's nap time at the farm, but one un-sleepy baby has a different plan... Baby wants to dance.




Carle, Eric

Encourages the reader to exercise by following the movements of various animals.




Cronin, Doreen

Rhyming text describes the many ways to wiggle.




Fox, Mem

A toddler plays peek-a-boo throughout the day.





How many kisses does a tired baby need to change her from crying into sleeping?





A loving father counts the number of hugs he gives his baby to say I love you.




Milord, Susan

A baby makes various sounds as he explores the world around him.




O'Keefe, Susan

When Mr. Horse gives a ride to his friends, Cat, Dog, Pig, and Duck, they urge him to go faster and faster.




Sturges, Philemon

The itsy-bitsy spider encounters a fan, a mouse, a cat, and a rocking chair as she makes her way to the top of a tree to spin her web.





Mama Bunny tries to bathe her energetic toddler.





Whether it is by croak, flutter, or fur, all children claim their mothers as their own.




Weeks, Sarah

From morning to night, a young child playfully grabs and throws items, including a bathtime rubber ducky and snacktime raisins.




Williams, Sue

E-books for kids!

TumbleBookLibrary is an online collection of animated, talking picture books which teach kids the joy of reading in a format they'll love. TumbleBooks are created by adding animation, sound, music and narration to existing picture books in order to produce an electronic picture book which you can read, or have read to you.

The TumbleBook Library is a collection of licensed titles from children's book publishers.

The TumbleBookLibrary provides enrichment to students who are reading independently with a variety of high interest material. It also provides support to students who require skill building with a variety of exercises that can be matched with other areas of the curriculum.
